11.10. Assessment Strategy and Grading Criteria

The module offers controlled and uncontrolled assessments.

Controlled assessments will be given during a specific time frame. The students enrolled for Face to Face modality will be required to attend the examination venue physically. The examination venue will be monitored by the invigilators.

However, the students who join online will be required to switch on their webcams during the assessment. Google Meet platform will be utilised to conduct the online assessments. These sessions will be recorded for monitoring purposes.

Uncontrolled assessments will take place throughout the course of the study. These assessments will be submitted by the students via LMS (Moodle). The submissions will be checked for their similarity percentage and plagiarism via Turnitin software.

All the assessments conducted during the course will adhere to the Villa College Assessment policy and guidelines.

Details of the Continuous Assessments (100%):

Assessment will be ongoing, throughout the semester. These assessments aim to use a range of different skills and help to develop confidence, accuracy and promote fluent use of English. At the end of every two units, a short review will be conducted online, which will be based on the grammar, language, and skills that have been covered during the two topics covered before the review.

For the face-to-face students a Class Assessment is conducted in class in a controlled environment where the classroom's seating arrangement is organised similar to an exam hall and the assessment is invigilated by the module lecturer. The online modality students will be doing the quiz via LMS (Moodle). Google Meet platform will be utilised to conduct the online class assessment. These sessions will be recorded for monitoring purposes.

Both online and face-to-face modality students will submit the Assignment to Moodle. The submissions will be checked for their similarity percentage and plagiarism via Turnitin software.

The marks students attained from each coursework component is shown to the students prior to conducting the next component. The weightage of each component is tabulated below.
